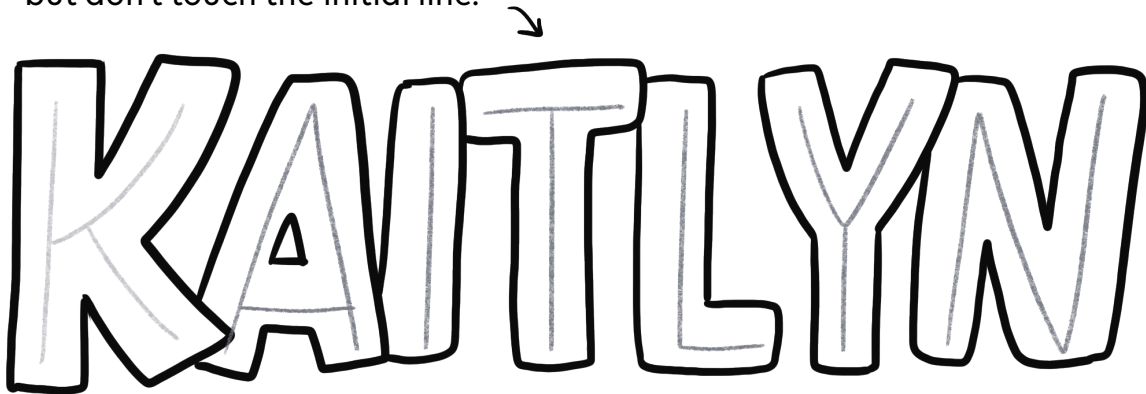


HOW TO DRAW BUBBLE LETTERS (AND ADD SHADING!)

1. In pencil, write a word large with letters spread out. Capital letters are easiest when learning.

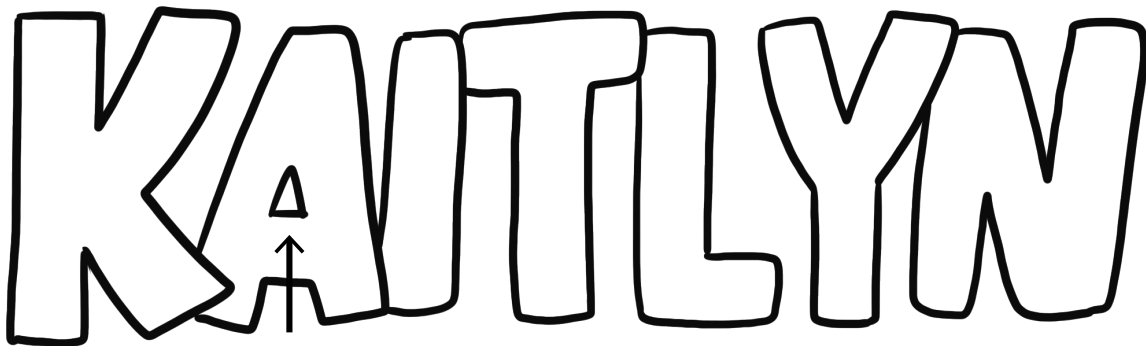


2. Trace around pencil lines to form a shape, but don't touch the initial line.



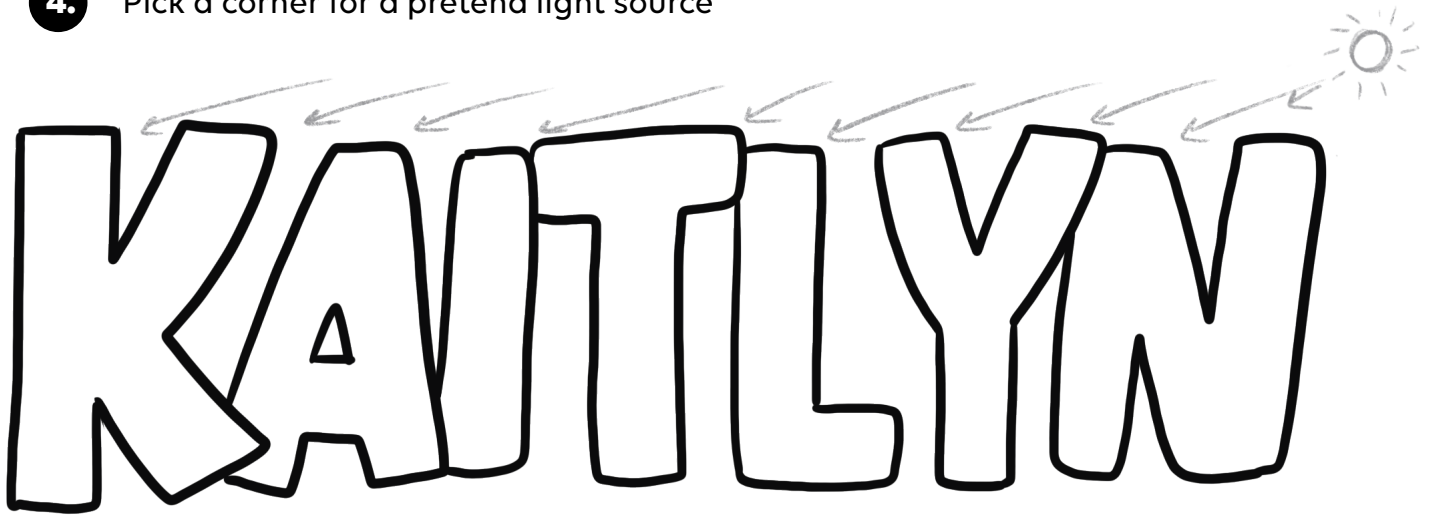
*IT'S OKAY IF LETTERS OVERLAP!
IT MAKES THEM LOOK MORE 3D!*

3. Erase initial pencil lines!

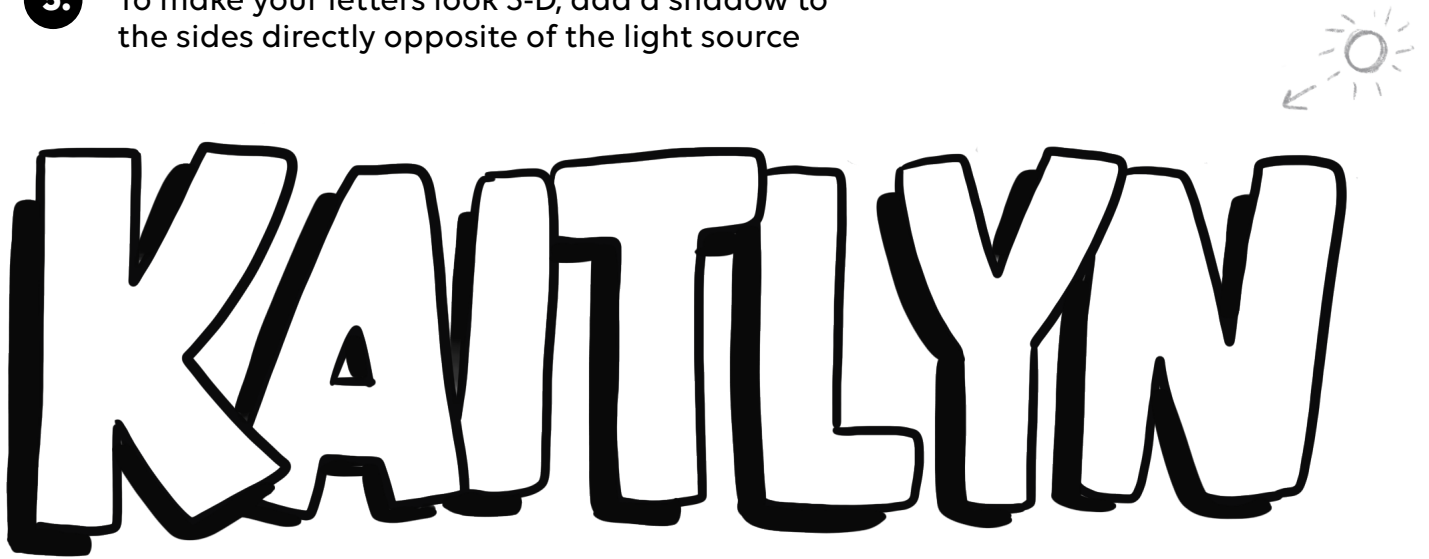


*FOR LETTERS WITH A "HOLE" IN THEM, DON'T FORGET TO DRAW
THE NEGATIVE SPACE (FOR LETTERS LIKE A, B, D, ETC...)*

4. Pick a corner for a pretend light source



5. To make your letters look 3-D, add a shadow to the sides directly opposite of the light source



*IF THE LIGHT IS COMING FROM THE TOP RIGHT,
THEN THE SHADOW WOULD BE IN THE BOTTOM LEFT*

TIP

a chistle chip marker works great for a drop shadow!

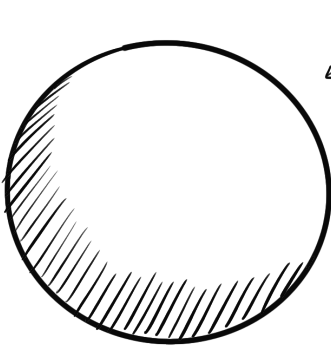


← Creates a thick line.

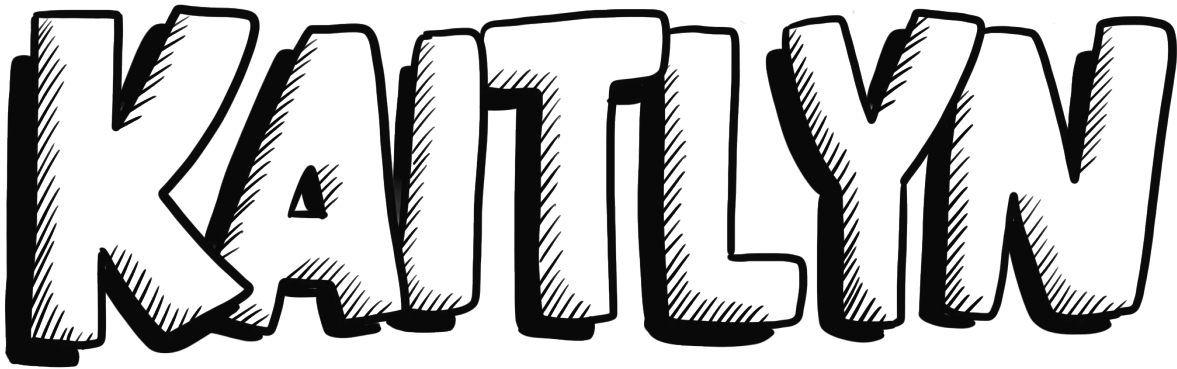
NOW LET'S TRY SHADING!

Here are just a couple techniques you could try.

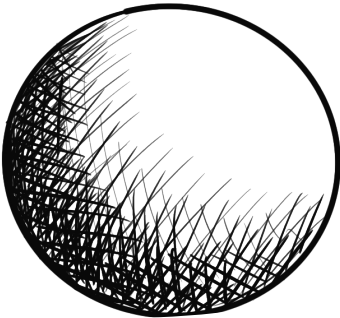


HATCHING

Lines going in one direction to create shading.
(closely spaced & parallel lines)

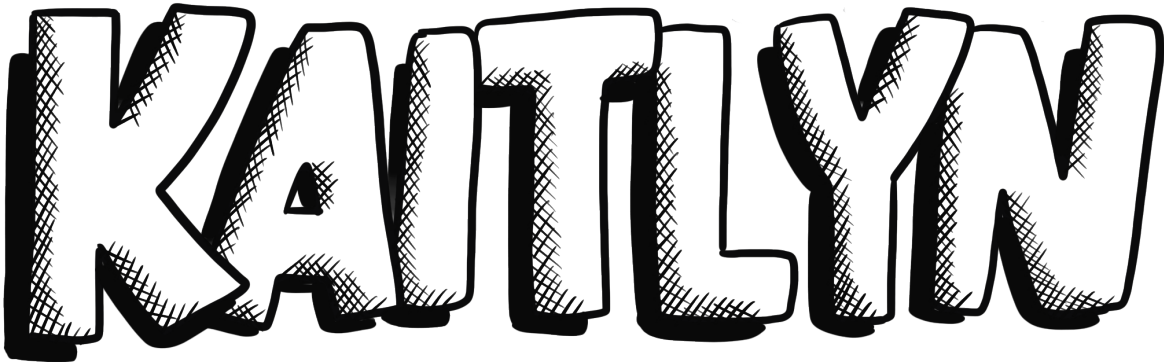


**DRAW LINES ON THE SAME SIDES
AS THE DROP SHADOW**



CROSS-HATCHING

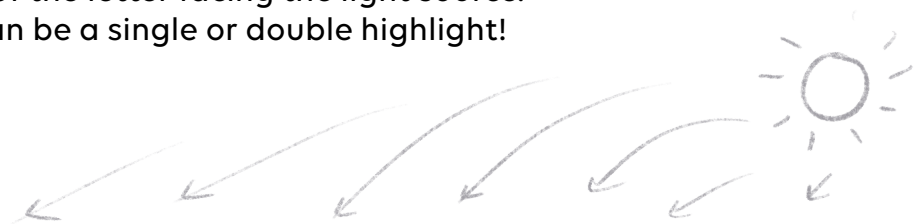
An extension of hatching
multiple layers of hatching to
create shading.



**ADD HATCHING LINES GOING IN
OPPOSITE DIRECTION OF FIRST SET**

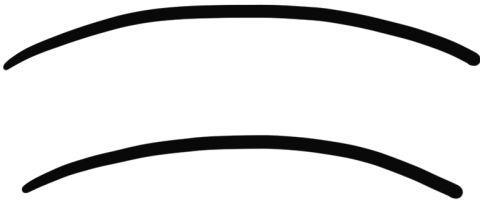
7. ADD A HIGHLIGHT!

Draw a highlight on the top corner of each part of the letter facing the light source. It can be a single or double highlight!

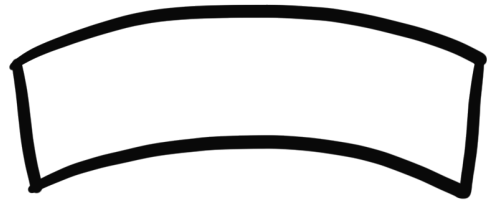
